Unofficial Meeting Minutes - Regular Meeting

The Regular Board of Education meeting was called to order by President Michael Tindall at 6:00pm.

Agenda was approved by Austin, supported by Naylor. Roll call vote: All yes; 7-0

OFFICIAL MEETINGS REPORTS

Minutes of the Regular Meeting on April 9th, 2022 were approved; motioned by Horky, supported by Naylor. Roll Call Vote: Yay's - 4; Abstained - 2 (Harvey & Austin)

Minutes of the Closed Session Meeting April 9th, 2022 were approved; motioned by Woods, supported by Naylor. Roll Call Vote: Yay's - 4 Abstained - 2 (Harvey & Austin)

TREASURER'S REPORT

Woods asked about 2 charges of the same charges from the credit card, and about Saline being on a Tiger Tickets purchase in which Andy Rousselo answered it was for a Marketing Program that Saline is the Consortium. Woods also questioned why the assistant football coaches are all getting paid but not other assistant coaches from different sports. Bezeau said he would follow up on that. OLD BUSINESS

Request for hearing (student discipline) - James Stewart presented to the board his additional information regarding his daughter's suspension case, asking for reversal off the record. The Board had an open back and forth discussion with Mr. Stewart. Woods made the motion to have the information reviewed once more. Tindall concluded there was no support for the motion made and moved to the next item.

NEW BUSINESS

- A. Washtenaw ISD 2021-2022 Mid-Year Report- information given by Dr. Bezeau to make sure the Board was aware.
- B. Manchester Literacy Presentation given by Sarah McCaffrey
McCaffrey started working on this project about a month and half ago with our Senators. She touched on the Shared History of Literacy, the conclusion of research for students that cannot read by first grade struggle with being poor readers from then on, Science of Reading, What's happening in Michigan with Literacy, her own personal journey with Literacy, and putting the Dyslexia Bill into Legislation. She also shared she applied for the Michigan Letters Training \$4 million grant and received some funds for K-3. She also discussed what we currently have in Manchester to help our students K-2 and 3-6 grades. Harvey asked is this identifying those who struggle with a curriculum? McCaffrey responded it's more of a process than a curriculum. Harvey also asked if it is different screening levels, and are we adapting different teaching methods. Dr. Bezeau responded he is proud of the time the teachers have dedicated to this process. Woods was concerned about masks and this new process. Villarreal responded it's more about the hearing and the sound versus the formation of the mouth. McCaffrey added that we also discuss how the sounds feel to us when we pronounce them.

- C. Strategic Framework Presentation given by the heads of Committees and Dr. Bezeau

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Different staff members touched on short term and long term goals of the five focus committees;(Andy Rousselo) Curriculum and Instruction, (Ben Bruursema) Technology, (Dr. Bezeau & Theresa Herron) Partnerships, (Karen Villarreal) Positive Environment, and (Shannon Cajic) Finance.

D. First Look at School Board Policies Revisions; 5511, 6110, 6114, 6325
Woods asked about bathroom policies. Harvey responded that it doesn't fall under the Gender Identity dress policy. Tindall commented there should be criteria. Dr. Bezeau responded that we will follow up with Neola for updates.

E. Village of Manchester/Chi-Bro Park Disc Golf Partnership
Tindall explained what was in the agreement; how close it was to the Klager Elementary, the yearly agreement, and it would be a no drugs/alcohol zone. Harvey asked if it was 400ft from the playground or the building. Tindall responded that it was from the playground. Novess asked are we protected from an out in our 1 year agreements. Tindall followed up with a 30 day out. Naylor asked if it was still used for our Cross Country team for practice. McCaffrey assured them that they changed their routes for practice. The Board accepted the user agreement as presented. Motioned by Tindall, supported by Austin Roll Call Vote; All yes; 7-0.
