- A. Klager / MECC -None
- B. Riverside -PTO & Volunteers put on a fantastic Riverside Fun Run, Halloween activities were fun for all with a parade and Costumes.
- C. Jr-Sr High School - CBI classroom cooked Thanksgiving meals for 50 people on November 15th, Parent/Teacher conferences went great, and the high school continues to thrive in building a positive Culture environment, Swwc came and spoke to 10th graders about upcoming opportunities for them.

Harvey gave a summary of the Legislative coffee, big topics are Lame Duck, Washtenaw having 7 voices versus 4 and how that will get the districts the help they need, and also streamlining paraprofessionals education to get them to become teachers and educators.
